

CREATING SUCCESSFUL PARTNERSHIPS

As a FMS Student You Are Expected to:

- Attend school every day and arrive on time.
- Know and conform to all district, school, and classroom rules.
- Strive to do your best at all times and never make excuses.
- Bring necessary materials to school/class every day and return all loaned materials.
- Schedule time to complete homework each day and complete all assignments in a timely manner.
- Maintain an accurate and orderly Agenda.
- Use Agenda to plan and manage short and long-term assignments. Obtain required signatures. If Agenda is lost or damaged, you must replace it at a cost of \$5.00.
- Bring necessary materials to school which includes the following: Agenda, 1 ¾" three-ring binder, subject dividers, zipper pouch, No. 2 pencils, pink pearl eraser, two pens (black or blue), 12" ruler, notebook paper, colored pencils, AR book, composition book, and FMS ID.
- Promote positive, non-disruptive, and respectful environments while on campus and in the classroom.
- Be an active participant in the classroom.
- Ask questions to assure you understand concepts and assignments. Stay after school if necessary.
- Keep all textbooks in a secure place. You will be charged for lost or damaged textbooks.
- Keep track of academic progress and discuss with a parent/guardian/teacher.

Parents/Guardians are Expected to:

- Support and enforce all school rules, including the timely arrival at school every day.
- Keep a positive attitude towards learning and the value of homework.
- Assure students come prepared to school with necessary materials.
- Provide a place to study, provide appropriate help and support with homework completion, and assure homework is turned in on time. Seek outside help for difficult areas of study.
- Use Agenda as a communication tool with teachers. Check, discuss, and sign Agenda daily/weekly.
- Review all progress reports and report cards. Keep in contact with teachers regarding academic progress.

Teachers are Expected to:

- Communicate learning goals, expectations, and the importance of homework to students and parents.
- Assist students in demonstrating self-control by providing structured classroom learning experiences.
- Require students to bring necessary materials to school every day.
- Require students to record assignments in Agenda on a daily basis, and use it to communicate with parents/guardians.
- Make sure students listen carefully, follow directions, ask questions, and follow time requirements.
- Assign appropriate assignments and give timely feedback on graded assignments.
- Provide guidance in seeking outside help for struggling students.
- Provide regular information to parents on academic progress.
